



Automatic External Defibrillators

In the event of a heart attack with cardiac arrest, Automatic External Defibrillators save lives by “jump-starting” the heart. However, they must be used within five minutes and people must be comfortable operating them.

Our Granite Lake Community is fortunate to have three defibrillators available at the lake within a mile of each other.

One is at the Chapel-by-The-Lake located in a well-marked kitchen cabinet **AED**

The **second AED** is at the home of Angel & Nick Nicoletti at 210 North Shore Rd. The AED is in a wooden case by the main entryway to their home .

The **third AED** is located at Dita and Bob Englund’s home 61 Cameron Cove. AED is on a shelf in their garden shed adjacent to the parking area.

Please identify **the nearest AED** to you and familiarize yourself with it’s exact location.
